




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Tony Witzkowski



Anthony "Tony" Witzkowski was the co-pilot of Wolf Pack, a B-24 Liberator (bomber) and part of Crew 27. Crew 27 was a member of the first thirty-two plane convoy to leave Sioux City, Iowa on November 11, 1943 - destination: Seething, England. After an eight-hop trip, Wolf Pack was among the first six planes to arrive in Seething on November 24th. Wolf Pack was then assigned to another crew. Crew 27 got a new B-24 Liberator that was named Tondelayo.

The airfield at Seething had three runways arranged in a crisscross triangle. Two were 1,400 yards long and the third was 2,000 yards. Men were housed in huts built outside of the airfield. The huts were barely heated by coal burning stoves. Transportation to and from the airfield was by bicycle or foot power.



Jack Barak, the Crew 27 pilot, implied that the same crew members were together for all thirty-one missions with only one minor injury to the navigator. Although the mission list documents only named the pilots, it is likely that Tony flew on the same missions as Jack Barak.

Crew 27 flew its first mission on December 30, 1943 and its second on January 4, 1944. The first challenge to the crews was to assemble a plane formation to transverse to the bombing site. The second challenge was to locate the bombing site which was difficult given the technology of the time. The early missions of the 448th were very difficult because of weather conditions and inexperience in all aspects of conducting wartime operations. In addition, there was very strong German resistance in the air as well as anti aircraft capability on the ground. Barak states, "We lost about a third of the first group (crews that arrived in Seething) in the first ten missions. The group stood down for several days for new crews, planes and training."

Mission targets for the 448th were located in both France and Germany. Seven missions targeted German v-1 missile sites under construction. V-1 missiles were intended for London blitz bombing. Of the recorded thirty-one missions, three were scrubbed because of mechanical difficulties or recall.

Bombs were not dropped on four missions because of bad weather. There were times when crews were assembled and sent off, only to be immediately recalled. These flights were not counted as missions flown.

On April 22, 1944, Crew 27 crashed Tondelayo on the Seething airstrip. The American formation was returning to England and several German fighter planes infiltrated the group and followed them back to home base. The German planes strafed the airfield making landing difficult. Because of fuel limitations, it became imperative to land and the American planes began to use one of the shorter runways. Two planes were unable to stop. The Tondelayo was third in line. The collision of the three planes resulted in severe damage to all three planes with no serious injuries to the crews. The Tondelayo was repaired and subsequently used for target practice. Crew 27 never flew her again.

Crew 27 flew thirty-one missions. Tondelayo was theirs for twelve and ten different planes for the remaining nineteen. Their last three sorties were on consecutive days six days before D-Day, June 6, 1944. Their span of service at Seething was a bit over six months.

In August, LGI Homes started to sell Velare at Twelve Bridges. Velare at Twelve Bridges is just north of Leatherby's. They are currently offering half plexes priced between \$439k and \$477k, and single-family homes ranging from \$522k to \$571k.

For those currently renting in Twelve Bridges, Velare presents an opportunity to transition from renting to owning. If you already cherish the community of Twelve Bridges, this could be the perfect chance to make it your permanent home. LGI Homes is facilitating this transition by offering to owner-occupied Velare home buyers a 2/1 buydown and they are also covering most of the closing costs.

What exactly is a 2/1 buydown? It's a financing option where the interest rate is temporarily reduced for the first two years of the mortgage term. It's subject to change, but is currently 4.375% for year one, 5.375% for year two and the remainder of the mortgage it remains at 6.375%. This significantly lowers monthly payments initially, providing a more manageable entry point into homeownership. Also, if interest rates drop within the next two years, you can refinance and keep the low payment permanently. It's important to fully understand this incentive so that you are not surprised by your monthly payment starting in the second and third year. Also no one can predict rates in the future for certain.






While there was a slight dip in prices since the middle of 2022, we are now witnessing a gradual uptick. The inventory of available houses for sale remains low. We anticipate that if interest rates decrease slightly and as we transition into sunnier weather, prices will experience further upward movement. The current factors contributing to a sense of uncertainty include inflation, interest rates, and the upcoming election year. The next couple of months will probably signal the direction that prices and number of available homes for sales will be for the year. Houses that are priced properly are seeing multiple offers over asking.



MORTGAGE UPDATE

Finally, there has been a notable shift in the Federal Reserve's stance on monetary policy, with anticipation now set for 3 or 4 rate cuts in 2024, reflecting a more aggressive approach compared to previous outlooks. Following their third consecutive meeting, the Fed has decided to maintain current rates, signaling an end to rate increases for this cycle and a forthcoming cycle of rate reductions. Looking ahead, the Fed projects 4 rate cuts in 2025 and an additional 3 in 2026.

The timing and extent of these rate cuts remain uncertain, with forecasts ranging from a reduction of up to 200 basis points to as low as 75 basis points. Bond expert Jeffrey Gundlach predicts a 10-year yield of 3% in 2024, a notable shift from previous levels, which were over 5% just a few months ago, and around 4.244% this morning (2/15).

It's important to note that despite the current Fed Funds rate ranging from 5.25% to 5.50%, it remains relatively restrictive due to the trajectory of inflation, which is expected to trend lower. Additionally, ongoing sales of treasuries and bonds further constrain monetary policy. The next anticipated step for the Fed would involve halting these sales, as it would be counterintuitive to lower rates while divesting these assets. The cessation of sales is expected to naturally lower rates, with the possibility of further rate reductions through quantitative easing measures.

Mortgage bonds have experienced a significant increase of 70 basis points, indicating a positive trend. However, market performance tomorrow may see some profit-taking, potentially leading to a slight retreat in rates. Nevertheless, the current outlook suggests favorable conditions for lower mortgage rates, signaling a return to a more normalized market environment for home purchases in 2024.
